



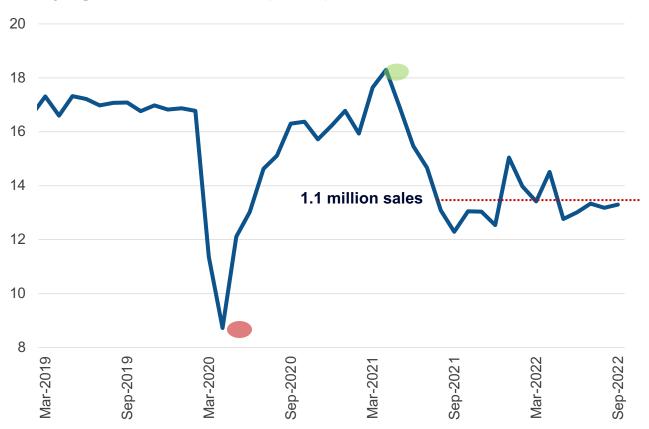

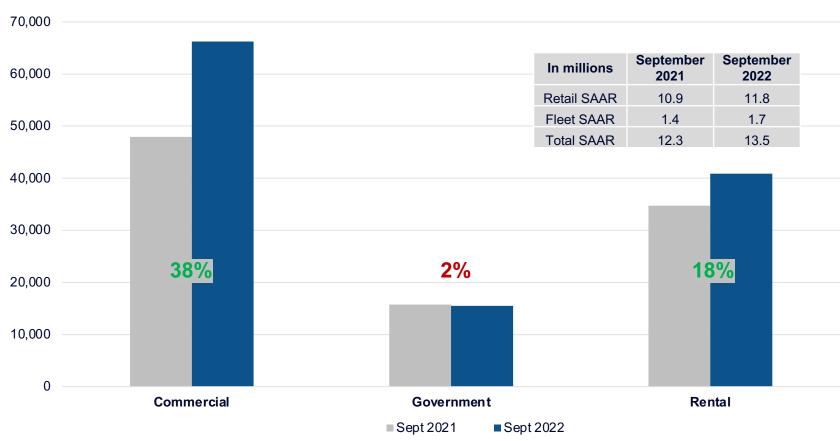


Fleet Sales | Combined Fleet Up 25%

Commercial fleet sales led the gains over last year with 38%



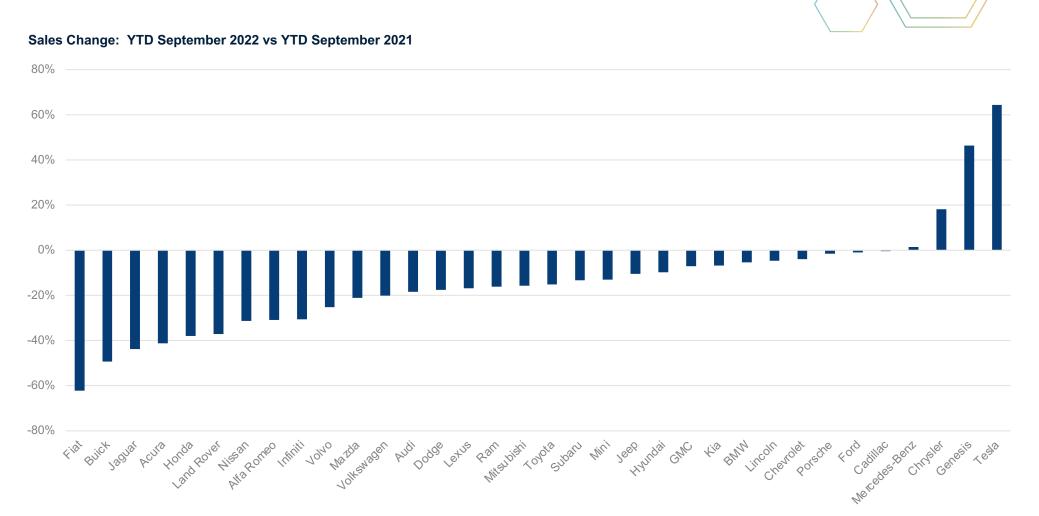
New Sales Estimates by Fleet Channel





YTD Brand Sales | Tesla and Genesis maintain the lead

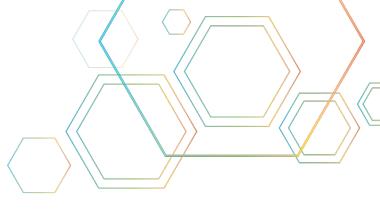




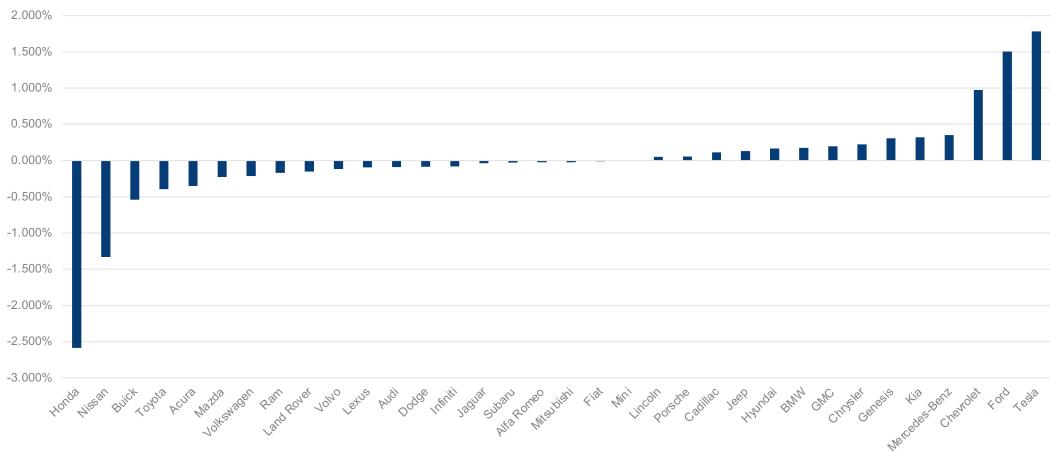


YTD Brand Share | Tesla back on top; Honda dead last

Honda's supply and inventory problems persist





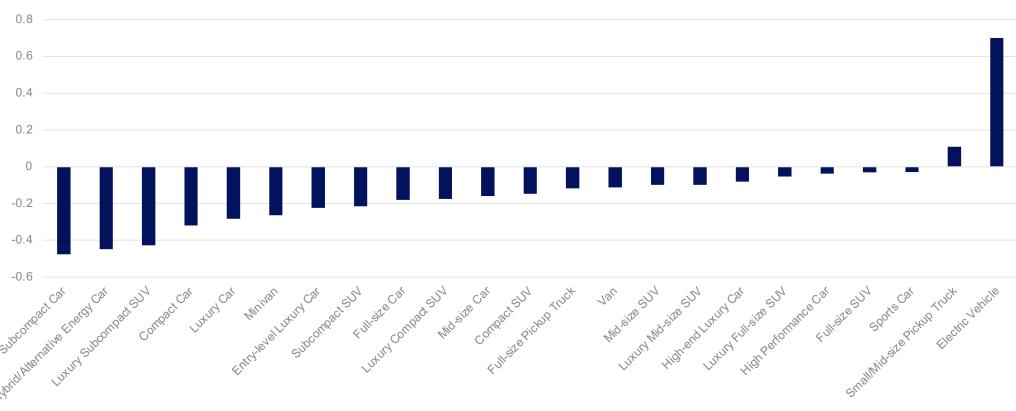


YTD Segment Sales | Small vehicles and Hybrids Underperforming

EVs and Small/Mid-size Pickup Trucks sales remain positive since last month

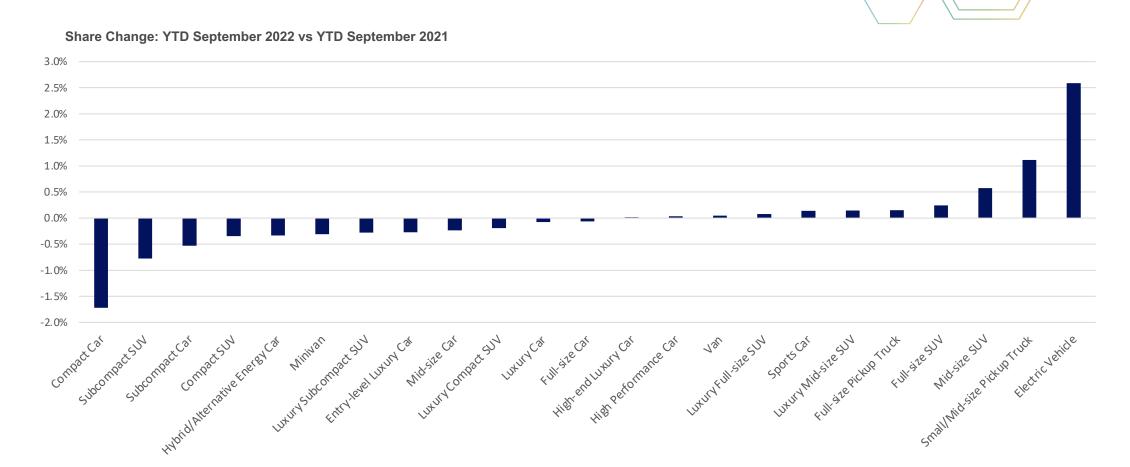






YTD Segment Share | Most Affordable Showing Lowest Share

Difficult to separate availability from consumer preference – but decline of cars continues







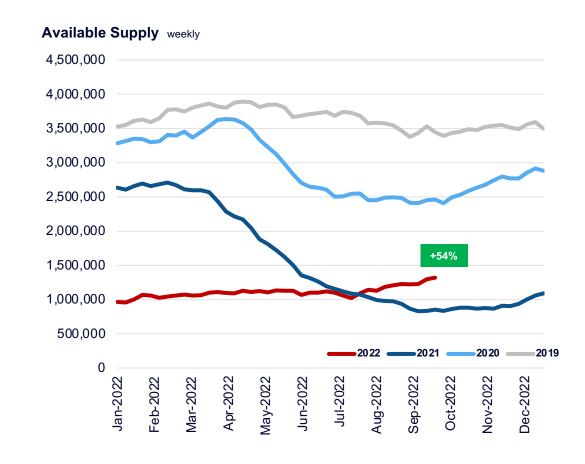

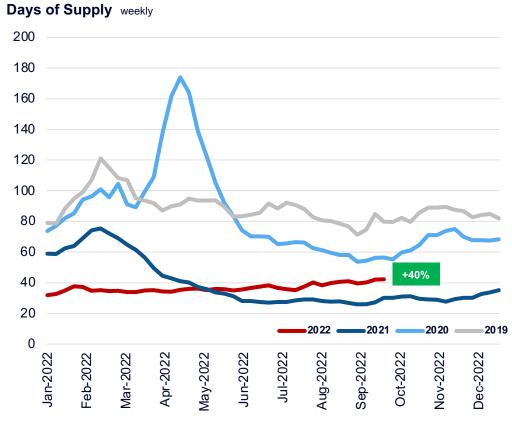

Supply situation slowly improving – now nearly 465K more vehicles than in 2021





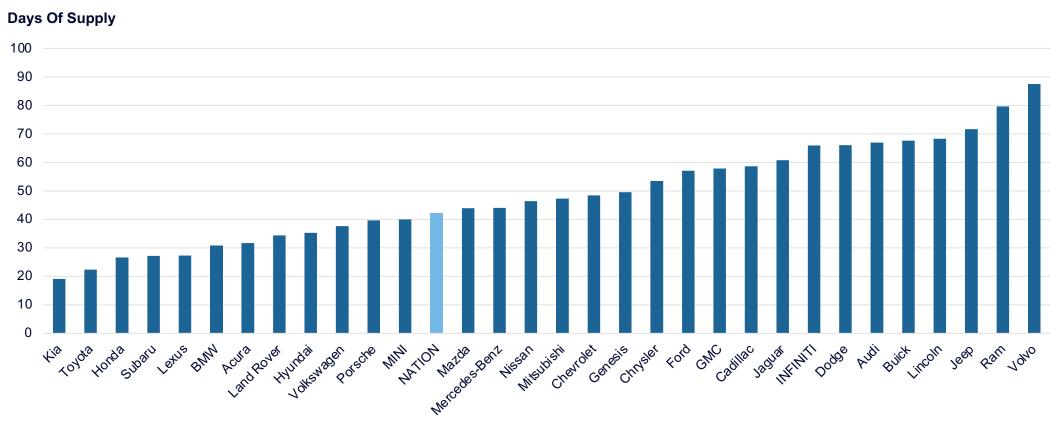




Brand Inventory | Supply Situation Varies

Kia, Honda, Toyota continue to have extremely tight supplies



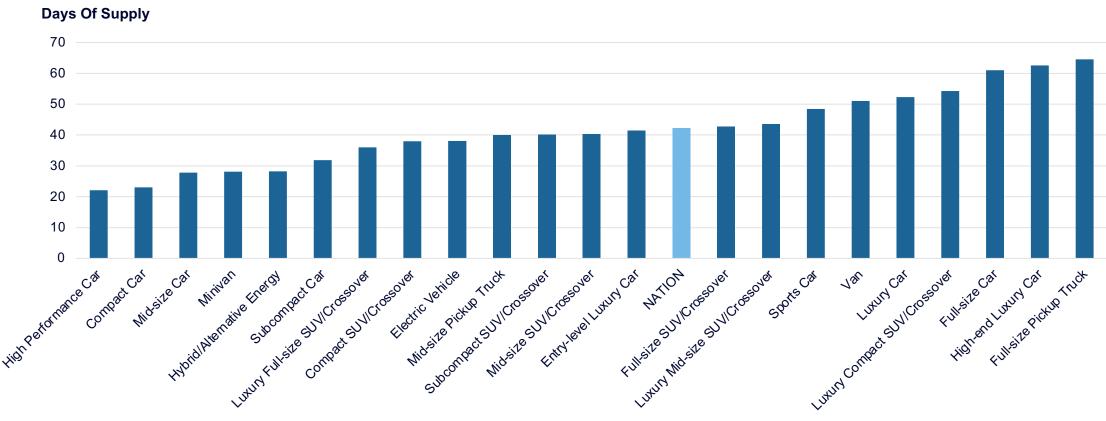




Segment Inventory | Small Cars Remain Tight

Big pickups and crossovers have more availability





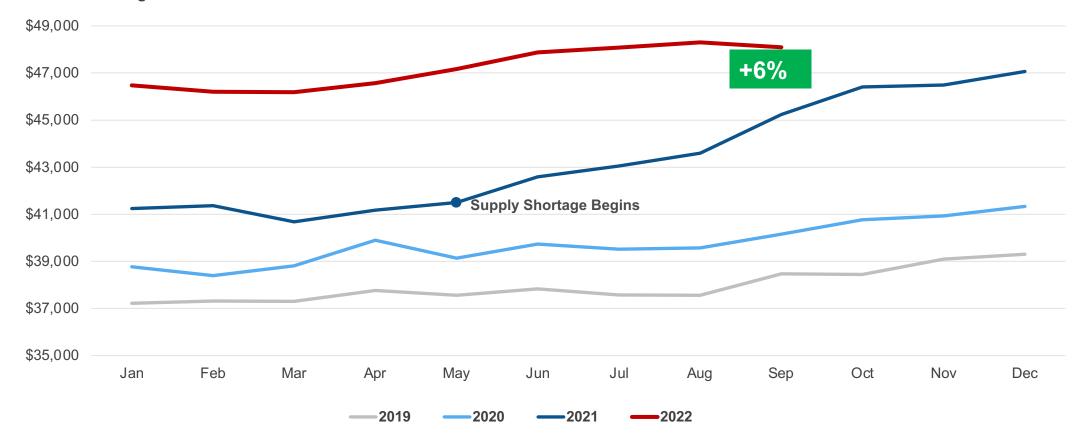


Transaction Prices | Now At \$48,301 – And Still Rising

Estimated AverageTransaction Prices

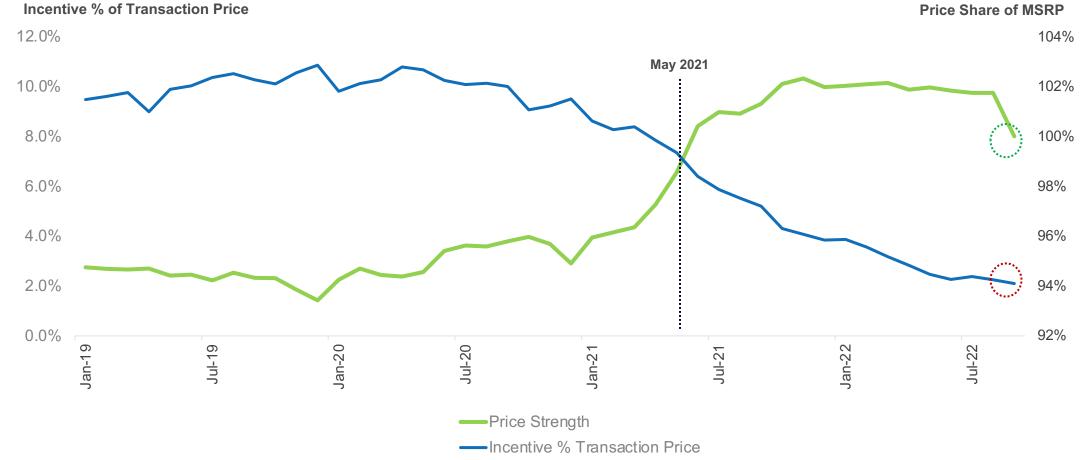




Seller's Market | Strong Margins Continue in 2022

The Index of Consumer Sentiment declined 0.7% in September but was up 1.0% week over week.

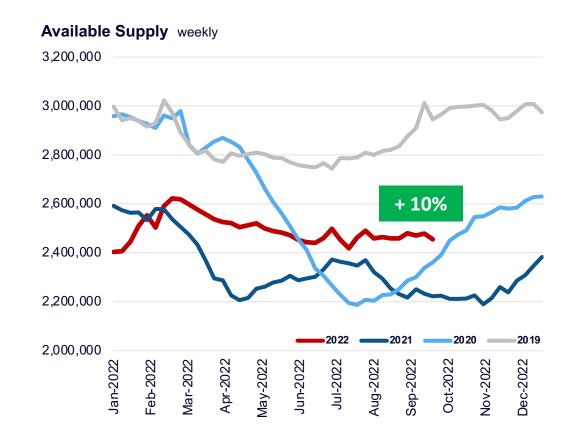


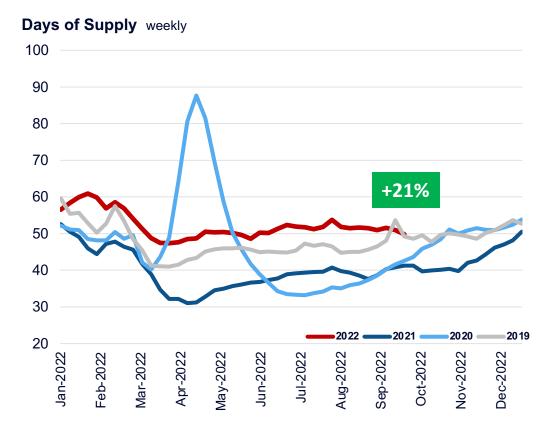


Used Vehicle Inventory | Higher By 10% Over Last Year

Sales pushed days of supply to 2019 levels.





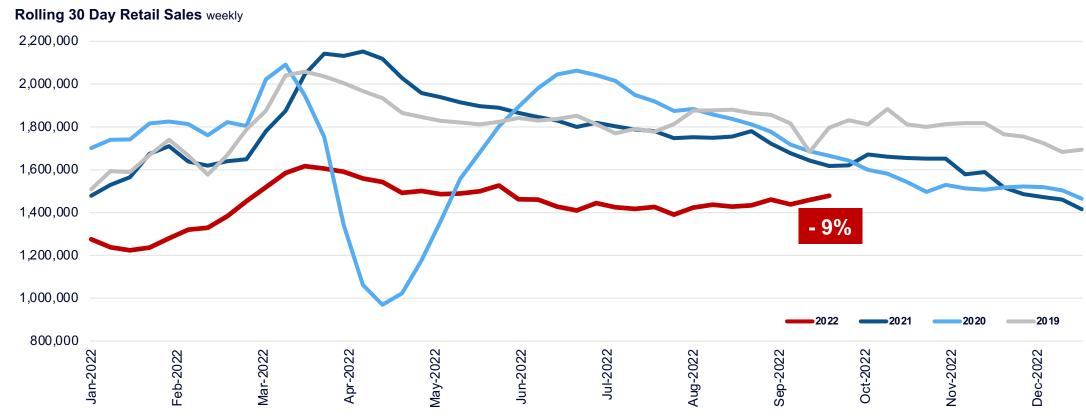




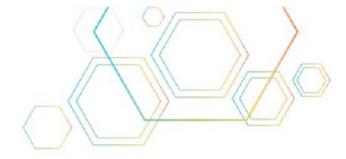
Used Vehicle Sales | Down 9% From Last Year

Still showing strength going into fall selling season.

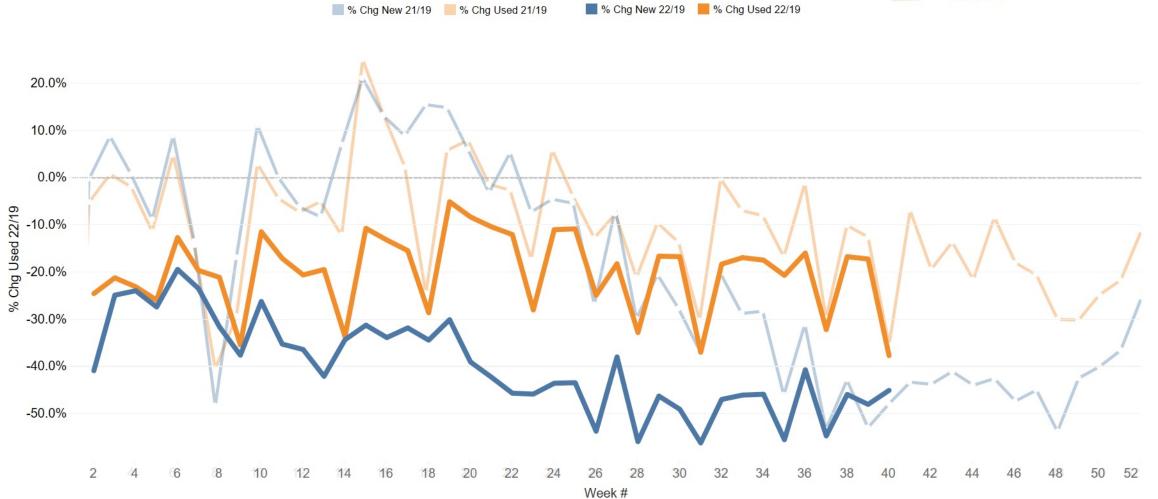

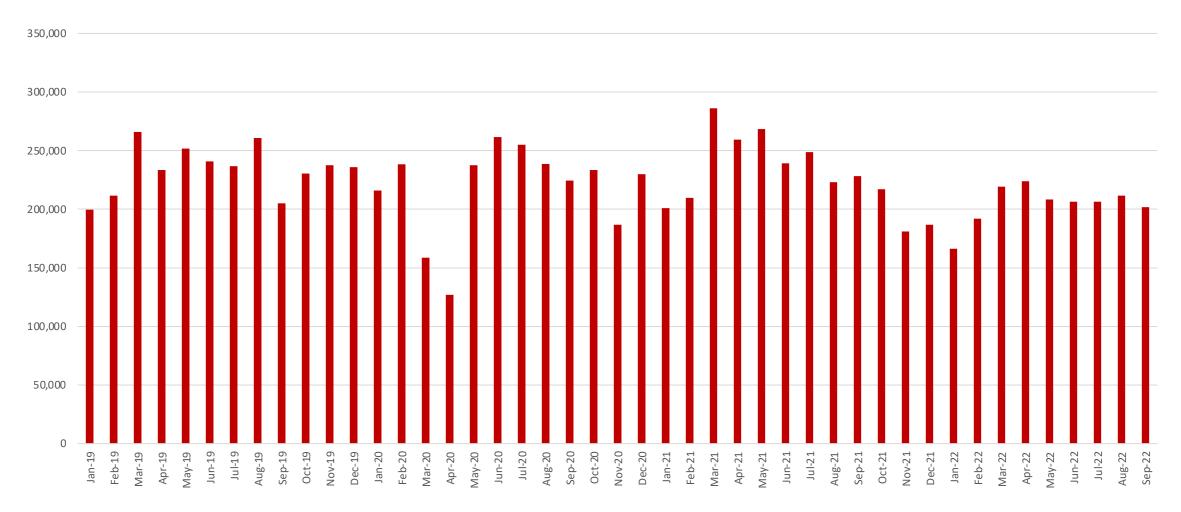


2022 and 2021 % Chg vs. 2019 in Retail Sales by Week

CPO sales decreased 4% in September and were down 11% against 2021.

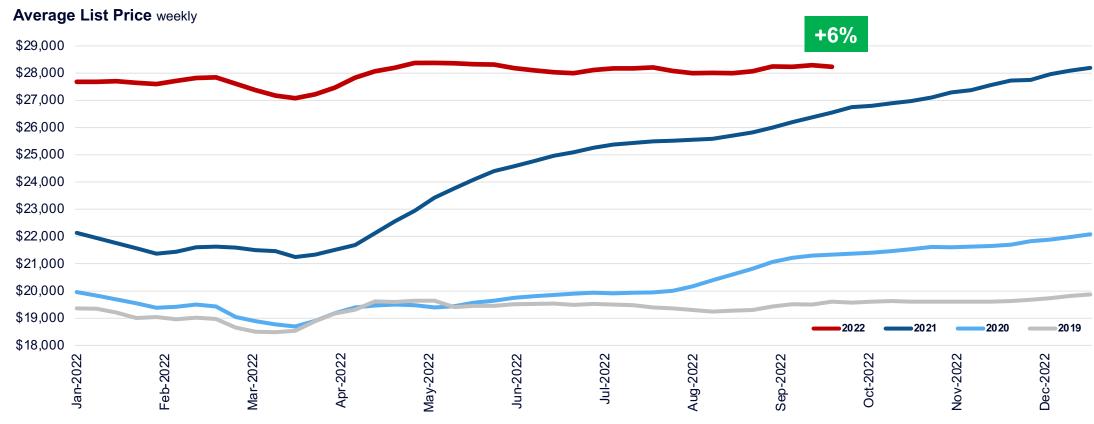




Used Vehicle List Price | Now Up 6% From Last Year

Price growth still slowing as anniversary of price shift passes.



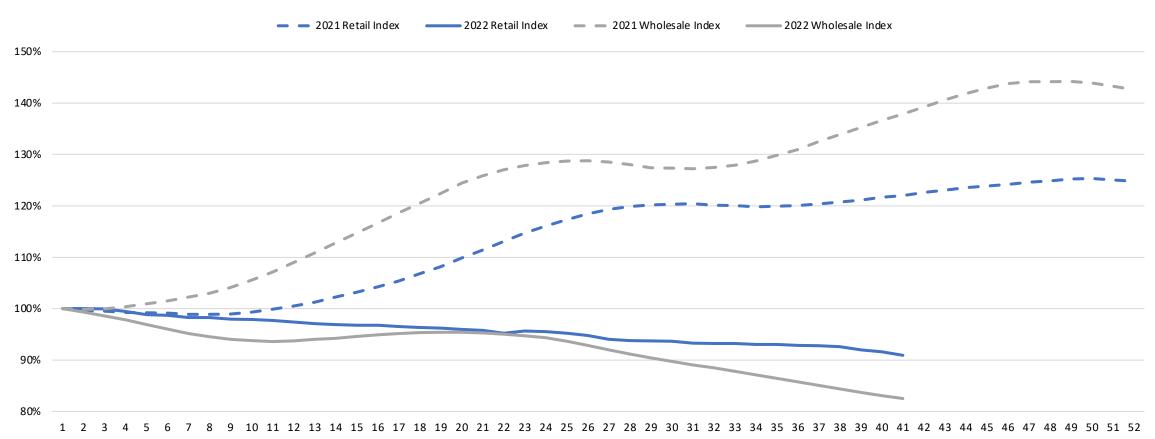


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Wholesale Used Prices Now Seeing Normal Depreciation
